Elders Board - Tim Law

With regrets, the Elders Board accepted the resignation of Pastor Calvin Fong who has served our church for almost 19 years. His last Sunday with our church is July 27, 2014. We are glad, however, to learn that God has opened a door for him to serve at a Baptist church in Saskatoon. We pray that God will continue to mightily use him and his family in the new place and give them strength and peace in the moving process in the coming months.

With the departure of Pastor Cal, the Elders Board has set up a transition committee headed by Brother John Chan to provide continuity to sustain, grow and transform the English Congregation in an effective way. The committee will subsume the existing English Core Group and will have additional members to help conduct its ministry.

Two town-hall meetings are scheduled in June to discuss the two reports submitted for scrutiny at the Spring Congregation Meeting on the church planting initiative, one in English on June 1, and the other in Cantonese and Mandarin on June 15. The purpose of the meetings is to help us further understand the various issues related to the initiative. As we believe if the vision of the Elders Board on the timing of planting a church is right, God will affirm it in the congregations. Therefore we urge brothers and sisters to get more acquainted with the church planting initiative and continue to pray to seek God's will. It is planned a decision will be made in a congregation meeting to be held at an appropriate time.

The Elders Board has adopted a combination of education leave and special assignment for Pastor Joshua to take in the coming months. The education leave consists of 8 weeks for Pastor Josh to better equip to serve and to have spiritual renewal. The special assignment consists of 4 weeks for Pastor Josh to devote on the church planting initiative. The leave will start in early July and it may be broken into parts to accommodate Pastor Josh to participate in church activities that he has been heavily involved. Let us support Pastor Josh in prayer.

<u>Youth Ministry</u> – Pastor Joshua Wang

What a beautiful time of the year as we welcome the warmer weather and the new life that emerges in Spring! We rejoice in the new life that God has given us through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ! What a blessing it is to celebrate what the Lord has been doing in the lives of those that we minister to! God has been incredibly gracious to us the last couple of months!

In March, we had a powerful time at our 2014 Renewal Retreat from March 14-16th! We had 41 youth from CCCO participate along with 10 adults. In total we had 56 youth and 13 adults attend. In Sr. High we spoke about the theme of Surrender: stuff, sin and self. Jr. High focused on encountering God through prayer, time in the Word and getting to know Jesus more. It was incredibly encouraging to walk alongside youth who were in tears because they were overwhelmed with joy or convicted to make some major changes in life. Some youth were convicted that they



needed to share the gospel with her hurting friends; others needed to make changes in their relationships and some committed to deepening relationships in the fellowship. Daniel Wang shared regarding his experiences of the retreat in the recent CCCOK sharing edition. Many of the Jr. High students spent time in the Scriptures and were writing in their journals during free time!

Following the retreat, we had a very powerful time of sharing in the YF. Our youth group shared what God had been doing in their lives, convicting them of sin, transforming their hearts and some things they wanted prayer for. It was an incredibly emotional time of sharing and one that has brought them even closer to one another.

In April, we participated in No Other Name, a city-wide Good Friday celebration where 39 of our youth (PE and YF) attended. Our youth were impacted through a full day of worship, workshops and speakers. The youth were able to select which workshops were most relevant to them along with some powerful messages and a call to live out the love of Christ for their friends. The following Friday, we reserved some time in small groups to pray for each of these friends. The youth wrote their names on a variety of colored pieces of paper and we assembled a mosaic in the youth room to remind us to pray for these individuals and that the Lord is mighty to save.

We also had a relationship talk with the Pure Energy. We focused on the fruit of the Spirit and cultivating these characteristics in our lives prior to beginning a relationship. It is also wise to look for these characteristics in others when considering a relationship. Through shaping their lives based on the character of Christ, we pray that our young people will be able to prepare themselves for healthy marriages and that they would be able to model godly lives for their children.

Since our last update, the YF and Pure Energy have completed a few series. The YF completed our lengthy study in Romans; we went through chapter by chapter as it is a very important book that covers many fundamentals of Christianity. The youth studied and discussed many important doctrines like justification, sanctification and practical topics regarding principles of conscience, honoring God with our lives and Christian civil duty. We completed a series in Spiritual Formation where we cover material and give them homework based on the themes each week. Each day, youth are encouraged to read a selected Scripture passage and ask themselves reflective questions or various exercises. We had almost 15 of the youth that regularly committed themselves to the daily devotions with a handful of youth that completed all 7 weeks. The Pure Energy and the YF also finished the Courage series which focused on the story of Daniel. The themes included Standing Alone, Standing Firm and Standing out. It has been a great discussion series as it deals with many of the temptations that teens face on a daily basis.

In May our youth have begun three new series. The Pure Energy is working through a series entitled Amazing Grace. This series helps teens understand God's amazing gift of grace, the relationship between grace and works, why grace doesn't mean you should keep sinning, and how grace should impact your purpose in life. In YF, we began a series in 1 Peter. Since the beginning, there has been no shortage of suffering in the



world. Today is no exception when we are surrounded by death, illness in our families, financial troubles and stress. How can we navigate the difficulties of this fallen world? I Peter reveals many of God's promises for the persecuted church, He promises to be with us, to comfort us in our suffering and that He will use these trials for our growth and God's glory. In Sunday school, we began a series in James. This study highlights that every generation in the church seems to worry about people who enjoy what they hear in church but is alarmed when it doesn't seem to make a difference in their lives. For James, translating faith into action is the heart of his message. This genuine faith is the faith that justifies, the faith that saves, and the faith that is desperately needed today.

Recently, our youth have been hard at work arranging various aspects of our coffeehouse outreach. They are spending time in the evenings sending out e-mails, invitations, buying crafts, decorations and even food items in preparation for the event. It is encouraging to see the amount of attention they pay to detail and their desire to offer excellence to the Lord. Some have been preparing for sharing their testimonies, presenting music, drama or chairing the event. Please pray that the Lord would work in the hearts of their unbelieving friends and that we would continue to see His hand at work in their lives!

For several weeks, we have been preparing for our annual mission trip to Ouje-Bougoumou! This year, we received an abundance of applications and unfortunately we are not able to bring everyone as we need to provide as many spaces as we can for the Cree youth! Please pray for us and consider joining our annual prayer and fasting campaign as we pray for the Holy Spirit to work in the lives of the youth!

We've been dreaming to have our own CM pastoral staff to lead, direct, train and shepherd in this ministry for the sake of the most precious future generation and their parents. We pray that the discussions brought up in the leadership conference can let our church to take a fresh look again into the fundamental needs in CM. This is a quote from an article: "Just because you call your church a family church doesn't make it one... I think our actions speak louder than words..." Therefore, we pray that actions will follow that the ideas brought up would not slowly wither after the leadership conference discussions.

There won't be VBS this summer, so most of the CM programs will round up by the end of June and resume again in September. There will be one class on Sundays in July and August during worship time (10:00am) for kindergarten to grade 2 children. Many of the leaders and teachers have been serving tirelessly and faithfully every week throughout the school terms despite their own personal work and home commitment; pray that God will grant them a restful summer to be renewed and refreshed.
